

Senior Adult


The Senior Adult Committee met on Thursday, February 28th for our yearly planning. A calendar full of great events will be published soon!

A Stewardship Reflection: Benefits of Putting Your Heart into Your Estate Plan



Dennis Fain, Bob Reneau and I provided an estate planning program for Keenagers last month. We are grateful for the positive response, and we'll be glad to come to other groups in our church who request our service. Preparing an estate plan is one of the best things you can do for yourself and your loved ones. You can have peace of mind to have confidence that your wishes will be implemented....in life and death. Furthermore, your family and friends will not have to make tough, stressful decisions during a difficult time. One keenager responded, "We also need to review our plans occasionally to see if changes are needed."

Bob shared impactful, real-life examples of the benefits of planning and what can happen if we don't plan. He prepared a helpful two-page questions and answers document; copies are available on the information table down the hallway outside the church office. Questions addressed include: What happens if you die without a Will? What comprises your probate Estate? What is a General and Durable Power of Attorney and do I need one? What is an Advanced Directive for Heath Care, and do I need one? What do I need to do to prepare a Last Will and Testament, a General and Power of Attorney, or an Advanced Directive for Health Care? How do I make certain that all of my final expenses will be paid? What are common problems facing most people in regard to Estate Planning?

Dennis shared meaningful ways you can also glorify God through your estate plan by including your First United Methodist Church in your current giving plans and through your Will. He conveyed heartwarming stories of faithful members whose witness of faith in their Will continues the work of our church in sharing Christ's love and transforming the world. We will share some of these examples in future articles.

While stuff is just stuff, we have a heart full of memories, joy and hard work in a lot of our stuff. Through our Will, we can remember those who are dear to our hearts, including our church. Assuring you have a Will is the last way in which you can demonstrate faithful stewardship of the resources with which God has blessed you.
