What is Most Important

You may have never heard of the man with one suit... it sounds like the opening line of a tall tale. For many people across the US, and even around the world, that crumpled, driven, faithful man was the person who introduced them to Jesus Christ. His name was Harry Denman, and I meet him once in Nashville, Tennessee when my dad worked for him at the Upper Room on Grand Avenue. Mr. Denman was a friend to taxi drivers, missionaries, housewives, students, world leaders, pastors and the United Methodist Church. A force to be reckoned with, Denman's service and commitment to Methodism spanned more than 60 years.

Mr. Denman sought to live his life as a testament to Jesus Christ in whom he believed passionately. Denman strongly challenged modern materialism and prejudice by exemplifying and teaching a simple life, and by personally relating to all people. His personal property was very limited for example: he usually had only one pair of shoes, one suit and refused to wear a watch, preferring to ask for the time as a way of starting a conversation. Articles that were given to him were generally given away to the needy. His friends had a hard time keeping him in a warm coat.

In the end, he considered himself no different from anyone else. He was called just like every Christian to show the love of Christ, writing: "Today, the only way one can see [Christ's] love is to see it wrapped up in a person. This is true of faith. The only way we can see Christ is to see him wrapped in a person. Evangelism can only be seen in a person. We need to become a package of love, a package of faith, and a package of Christ. Then we will be a package of evangelism." Building relationships with people was critical for Harry Denman, it helped him to bring Christ into their lives. One of Harry Denman's friend was Dr. Billy Graham who wrote, "Harry Denman was one of the great mentors for evangelism in my own life and ministry... the thing people will remember above all about Harry Denman was his love of Christ and his desire to see others come to know Him. He truly was one of those rare individuals whose impact will continue for generations to come."

The temporal things that we can possess should never be our focus in life. Still we think that if we only had more money, we could prevent problems from coming our way. We think that money will allow us to enjoy a better life. The sooner we get over the illusion that more stuff means a better life; the sooner we can pursue true treasure, a deep and abiding relationship with Jesus.

May God bless you and your family during the month of October as you seek what is most important, a deeper and more abiding relationship with Jesus.




