Walking With God

The Apostle John in his third letter wrote, "I have no greater joy than to hear that my children are walking in the truth." To walk in the truth is to walk with God. Have you ever thought about what it must be like to walk with God?

In the Old Testament we discover that: Adam and Eve knew the pleasure of walking with God in the cool of the morning. Enoch knew what it was like to walk faithfully with God. Enoch was such a close friend of God that one day they took a long walk together, and Enoch never came back. Moses walked so closely with God that his face would glow for hours after his encounter. Micah encourages us to walk humbly with your God.

The Christian walk is a dominant image in the New Testament, as well. Jesus said to his disciples, "If any man will come after me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow me." The call of Christ for us to follow him is a call for us to walk in his path, and to walk in his way.

Walking was also a favorite image of Paul. He exhorts us to: Walk worthy of our calling. Walk in love. Walk as children of light and to walk carefully. Our walk with God may be the only evidence of the Gospel that some people will see in this world. They will only know us and God in our life by our walk. Brother Lawrence was a 17th century French monk, today he is most commonly remembered for the classic Christian text, *The Practice of the Presence of God*. He wrote: "I walk before God simply, in faith, with humility and with love; and I apply myself diligently to do nothing and think nothing which may displease Him."

What if, by simply following Brother Lawrence's example, we could continually dwell in God's presence? When I think of walking simply before God, I am reminded of what Jesus said, "Unless you change and become like little children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven." To have the faith of a child is to trust and depend on God for everything we need in life. What if, we could be certain, deep down inside our heart, that God loves us more than anything humanly imaginable? God said, "I have loved you with an everlasting love. That is why I have continued to be faithful to you." Knowing that God loves us should encourage us to walk humbly before our God and to love like He loves.

What if, we realized that all God desires is our faithful attention, so He can share Himself with us? Paul said, "Do not conform any longer to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds." God's goal for us is that we might be conformed into the image of Jesus Christ.

This is a great time to think about how you are walking with God. Are you walking simply in faith before God? Are you walking with humility and love? Are you walking in a way that pleases God?

May God continue to bless you and your family during the month of September, as you continue walking with God.

Due to the chaotic events surrounding many police departments in our country, Sisters In Service wanted to show our thankfulness to the


