Are You Ready for Battle?

Some Christians are a little paranoid about evil powers lurking around every corner looking for someone to devour. That is an unfounded fear. Your relationship to demonic powers in the spiritual realm is a lot like your relationship to germs in the physical realm. You know that germs are all around you; in the air, in the water, in your food, in other people, and even in you. But you do not live in constant fear of them. The only appropriate response to the numerous germs around you is to eat the right foods, get plenty of rest, exercise, and keep yourself and your possessions clean. Then your immune system will protect you. However, if you do not believe in germs, you will be less likely to do those things. For instance, before the medical profession discovered the reality and nature of microbes, they saw no need to wear masks, scrub before surgery, or use antibiotics.

It is the same in the spiritual realm. Demons are like little invisible germs looking for someone to infect. We are never told in Scripture to be afraid of them. You just need to be aware of their reality and commit yourself to know the truth and live a righteous life. Remember, the only thing big about a demon is its mouth.

Demons are habitual liars. Your sanctuary is the position you have in Christ, and in Him, you have all the protection you need.

In his letter to the Ephesians, Paul describes the armor of God, which he has provided for our protection. The first thing you should understand about God's protection is that our role is not passive. Notice how often we are commanded to take an active role. "Finally, be strong in the Lord and in his mighty power. Put on the full armor of God so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes. For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms. Therefore, put on the full armor of God, so that when the day of evil comes, you may be able to stand your ground, and after you have done everything, to stand. Stand firm!

May God continue to bless you and your family during the month of January, as He prepares us to

embark on a new and exciting year.
