'I chose one. It took seven years of study and frustration before I made my first professional appearance. It took another seven to reach the Metropolitan Opera. And now I think whether it's laying bricks, writing a book--whatever we choose--we should give ourselves to it. Commitment, that's the key. Choose one chair."

Our challenge this year at First Methodist is to: Recommitment your life to Christ, Recommit your life to the Church, and Make a difference in someone's life every day this year. If we all work together serving the Lord and others this year, we can turn the world upside down. May God continue to bless you and your family in the month of February.

My prayer is that God will give you many opportunities to express your love for God and others throughout this coming year. In Christ's Arms, Brother Matt


