What's Love Got to Do with It?

Several places in the Bible we are asked this question: "What does God require of his people?" The answer is, "**to love the LORD your God, to walk in all his ways, to obey his commands, to hold fast to him and to serve him with all your heart and all your soul**". So, what's love got to do with it? Love is the glue that holds everything else together. Without love there is no motivation to do the other things.

So where does this love come from? Paul reminds us that we are dealing with a supernatural love—a love that is "**poured out within our hearts through the Holy Spirit**" (Romans 5:5). In other words, until you enter into a right relationship with God you do not know God's love and you cannot love God the way he wants you to love him.

As we know, man's love is centered on himself; when he finds something attractive; he loves it and wants it. Supernatural love has quite a different emphasis. It has the ability to love the unlovely and unattractive. We see this quality in the way God loved us, because "God proves his love for us in that while we still were sinners Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8). He loved us while we were still his enemies, while we were still physically, spiritually, and morally unattractive to him. Once the Holy Spirit begins to reveal this supernatural love to us, we too can begin to love others the way God loves them.

Most of us want our relationships to be better. The problem is we do not want to change; we want to get some sort of change out of the other person.

However, at this point, we run into an interesting Biblical truth—God never asks us to change another person, only to stay yielded to him. So that, he might use that person to bring about some change in us.

So, if you really want change in any relationship, you have to ask yourself this question: Am I willing to ask God to change my own heart and actions first? It is amazing the changes that can occur in a relationship when the other person sees that you are willing to forgive, repent, and love them for who they are. Isn't that how God first loved you?

How do you love the Lord with all your heart, soul, mind, and strength?

When we focused on being renewed, I was often reminded of a powerful, memorable Mark 12:29-31 message I heard from a pastor whose name I have long forgotten. He connected heart with sympathy . . . soul with empathy . . . mind with asking what can I do . . .and, strength with just doing it. Here's one way God leads me to apply that Scripture to my life.

When I hear someone talk about a loved one dealing with chronic dementia, my initial response is one of a <u>prayerful heart of sympathy</u>. Oh my, what a challenging disease with no cure! How awful that the number with the disease is increasing significantly throughout society! Then, my <u>soul of empathy</u> responds; after all, my husband had an eight-year journey through Alzheimer's. I totally relate to the exhausting, heartbreaking journey the patient, the entire family, and friends experience, as the patient's world gets smaller, their memories dim, and the ability to do simple tasks decreases. Yet, there is a critical need to sustain the patient's dignity and to cherish the patient whose life is exceedingly more than the disease. Thus, my personal experiences ignite my <u>mind to ask what can I do</u> to help the patient or support the caregivers. What is their most urgent need? Information about the disease? Someone to physically be there to lend help, run an errand, or give the caregiver a break? Then, I pray for the willingness and <u>strength to "just do it"</u>- do something that brings a moment of joy to the patient or a moment of encouragement and hope for the caregiver. Through caring action, I love my neighbor as I know God loves me.

Look among our church family and you will see lots of people prayerfully applying this Scripture, with their time, talents, and treasure. Those with grateful hearts sharing whatever they can . . . those recovering from addictions . . . widows and widowers . . . single parents . . . those who have gone through divorce . . . those who have experienced the death of a child . . . those who have lost jobs . . . those who struggle with anxiety and depression . . . and so many other conditions. We know "in ALL things God works for good for those who love Him." Yes, God works through us to turn our pain, grief, or whatever we are going through into His healing hope to experience joy in ways we never anticipated possible - for others and for ourselves - to His honor and glory.
