### What a Friend We Have in Jesus!

THE GREEK word Philos (Friend) appears 29 times in the New Testament. It emphasizes a special relationship we can have with a person who knows us well, has been one of us, and yet has the power to solve our problems and relieve our sorrow. This is the type of friendship Jesus desires with each of us.

Who knows us better?
Both the Old Testament character Jeremiah and the New Testament character Paul would attest to the fact that; He knew you before He formed you in your mother's womb. He set you apart and determined the times set for you and the exact places where you should live. Jesus knows you better than anyone else, but he also knows what is best for you. He has been one of us?

Jesus left behind many things to visit this world. He left the glory of heaven. We know little about what heaven looks like. We know it is inhabited by God and his angels. And John the Revelator describes it as a beautiful place.

By coming to earth as a human, Jesus took on certain limitations. For example, the timeless One became bound by time. He had basic human needs for food, rest, warmth, shelter and more. Having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end" (John 13:1). Jesus has always had people in the world that are his own; he has purchased them, and paid dearly for them, and he has set them apart for himself. All he asks in return is that we devote our lives to Him. The way we do that is to ask Jesus into our hearts, ask Him to forgive our sins and be the Lord of our lives. Those whom Christ loves; he loves to the end. Nothing can separate a true believer from the love of Christ. What a friend we have in Jesus!



# Trails Temple Ministry


We have 2 groups of folks walking at Gold Star Park on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays behind City
