### **Treasures in Heaven**

Jesus said in the gospel of Matthew, "Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth...but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven" (Matthew 6:19, 20). What does that mean for us in these days? How can we appropriate this principle into our lives?

I love the story of Alexander the Great as he was nearing the end of his life. On his death bed he called his generals and said to them, "I have three wishes." First, he wanted his physicians to carry his coffin. Secondly, he wanted his gold, silver and precious stones thrown on the pathway leading to the gravesite. Lastly, he wanted both his hands dangling out of his coffin. One brave soul asked him, "O king, tell us why you make such strange wishes?"

His response was, "I want my physicians to carry my coffin to remind people that no doctor on this earth can really save a person from the clutches of death. I want my gold, silver and other riches thrown on the pathway to tell people that not even a fraction of my gold will come with me. And I want my hands dangling out of the coffin, to let people know that I came empty handed into this world and empty handed I go out of this world".

The Bible mentions that rewards await the believer who serves the Lord faithfully in this world. A "great" reward is promised to those who are persecuted for Jesus' sake and various crowns are also mentioned. Jesus says that He will bring these rewards with Him when He returns. How do we prioritize our lives so that we can receive these rewards one day? We treasure the Lord Jesus most of all.

When Jesus is our treasure, we will commit our resources—our money, our time, our talents—to His work in this world. Our motivation for what we do is important. Paul encourages servants that God has an eternal reward for those who are motivated to serve Christ: "Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for human masters, since you know that you will receive an inheritance from the Lord as a reward. It is the Lord Christ you are serving" (Colossians 3:23–24).

When we live sacrificially for Jesus' sake and serve Him by serving the body of Christ, we store up treasures in heaven. Even seemingly small acts of service do not go unnoticed by God. Think of what Jesus said, "If anyone gives even a cup of cold water to one of these little ones who is my disciple, truly I tell you, that person will certainly not lose their reward" (Matthew 10:42). Mother Teresa said, "Not all of us can do great things. But we can do small things with great love."

What a great idea for our church family at First Methodist to focus on during the month of September. As we treasure Jesus in our lives, we can do all things for him with great love.

### Moving Closer to A DVD Ministry for Our Homebound

After months and months of unavoidable delays, we are finally moving to the next step of developing an active DVD Ministry. A DVD Ministry will deliver recorded discs of our worship services to homebound folks who can't attend worship services with us and can't connect to our services online or on their phones.



We became aware of this critical congregational need this past winter. While it is great that we have the technology to provide streaming and online services, it is totally unacceptable to have people who not only can't return to in-church services, they have no way to electronically access our worship services. There have been a series of hurdles to leap as we addressed the issues to develop this new ministry. Overcoming each challenge has been a testament to how much our individual and collective giving matters . . . the giving of prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness.

A team of volunteer callers identified the names of folks who wanted to participate in a DVD Ministry. As per request, we will purchase DVD players for those folks who do not have players or need old outdated ones replaced. Some folks will need assistance to operate them, and we have members who have volunteered to assist in this matter. We also discovered that we needed special equipment to actually implement the recording and make copies of the DVD discs. Our talented technology team identified what we needed and ordered it. Then came the delivery delays. In these uncertain times, such delays were not uncommon. Good news: the equipment has arrived and training is in process!

Celestra Rowell, our Senior Adult Services Director, is contacting those who originally requested to participate in receiving the discs and determine their equipment needs. If you or someone you know wants to be added to this list, please contact Celestra or let someone at the church office know of your wishes. There have been quite a number of hiccups since the beginning of this process, and we deeply appreciate your continued patience as we address other details for this ministry to become reality. That said, this will be another meaningful way for us to share our worship services and strengthen our connection with homebound citizens. To God be the glory!
