Worship the Lord

“Wearing a linen ephod, David was dancing before the LORD with all his might, while he and all Israel were bringing up the ark of the LORD with shouts and the sound of trumpets” (2 Samuel 6:14). In one of the most heartfelt displays of worship recorded in the Bible, King David danced “before the Lord with all his might.” The occasion was the return of the Ark of the Covenant to Jerusalem. It was a day of rejoicing as David “and all Israel were bringing up the ark of the Lord with shouts and the sound of trumpets.” David had set aside his royal robes and was “wearing a linen ephod.”

When someone says the word worship, we often times think of a church service. Or maybe we think of a spiritual retreat. We usually think about a worship leader on stage guiding us through songs, scripture and then the sermon. Sometimes the order changes, sometimes it doesn't. To most of us, that is all the worship we know. But worship is so much more than a church service or worship leader.

We all have our own opinions of worship and that is partly the problem. We think worship is about us and what we gain from doing it. We walk into church expecting to be entertained because that happens everywhere else we go. We go to the movies, we're entertained. We go to a sports game, we're entertained. We see our favorite band in concert, we're entertained. We plug in our video game system, we're entertained. We watch TV, we're entertained. We walk into church, we want to be entertained.

But worship is not about being entertained. By definition worship is about expressing our reverent love for the one true God and what he has done for us. Worship isn't always about the songs we sing, whether they are contemporary or traditional, slow or fast, rocking with an electric guitar or sung acapella. We can experience worship without any music at all. There are times in my life, when I just shut the music off and spend time in conversation with God, expressing my love and adoration for Him. This is worship.

True worship is a matter of the heart expressed through a lifestyle of holiness. If your lifestyle does not express the beauty of holiness through an extravagant love for God, and you do not live in daily submission to God, then I invite you to make worship a non-negotiable priority in your life. May God bless you and your family during the month of November, as we worship the Lord together.

Shining a light and getting others to focus on things happening in our society can be a good thing when it's done to challenge or boycott actions or ideas that are actually unjust or harmful. But sometimes we can be too quick to shame/call-out/cancel and become cruel without personally thinking things through instead of just joining in what others are saying and how they are responding. We don't always just do this on social media, though; we do it in our offline relationships too. In Jesus' time, people were often shamed, called-out, and canceled by society because they sinned, got sick, were poor or disabled, or because they were from a different country or culture. Jesus challenges our tendency to ignore, exclude, or despise people who are different from us by often making outcasts the center of His ministry. Through the teachings of Jesus and the story of Saul, this month we're going to be discussing and exploring how we are called to **love people who aren't like us, love people who are in need, love the people we are tempted to dislike because we wish we were more like them, and even love the people we are tempted to hate.**
