Times of Refreshing

On Sunday February 6, 1763, John Wesley wrote in his journal: “Knowing many were greatly tempted on occasion of these occurrences, I preached on 1 Corinthians 10:13, ‘God is faithful; he will not let you be tempted beyond what you can bear. But when you are tempted, he will also provide a way out so that you can stand up under it.’ In the evening, we had a love feast, at which many spoke with all simplicity. And their words were like fire. I hardly know when we have had so refreshing a season.” The love feast or Agape meal is a Christian gathering recalling the meals Jesus shared with disciples during his ministry and expressing the fellowship enjoyed by the family of God. Just as times of refreshing were enjoyed with Jesus and at this gathering almost 260 years ago; I believe that God wants to send times of refreshing into your life today.

I remember working in the hay fields with my grandfather when I was a teenager. Those hot summer days in the middle of the hay field with no shade would drain the life right out of you. Then out of nowhere a cool and gentle breeze would blow and refresh me. In a spiritual sense our lives can be like that hay field. We are hurried by the work, frustrated by coworkers, pressured by deadlines, tempted beyond what we can bear, and pushed to the breaking point to make ends meet. My hope is that you will begin today to pray and ask God to send times of refreshing into your life. If you will humble yourself and pray, God will answer your prayer.

Now imagine what your life will be like after God has answered your prayer and sent times of refreshing into your life. Paul reminds us that our lives are fragile like jars of clay and in these jars of clay ‘we always carry around in our body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be revealed in our body’ (2 Corinthians 4:10). You have been saved so that the life of Jesus may be revealed in your life. Imagine how wonderfully Jesus' life can be revealed in your life once you have been refreshed. Every day the Father is conforming you into the likeness of his Son and with each new day come opportunities to let others see Jesus in you. For some people the only Jesus they will see today, will be in you.

You and I did not do anything to deserve our salvation, but we must do something to exhibit that salvation. Paul is helpful here again, “continue to work out your salvation with fear and trembling” (Philippians 2:12). As Christians, we must rise to the occasion to allow our speech, our thinking, and our emotions to be the evidence that God is at work in our lives. It is called the fruit of the Spirit and since we live by the Spirit we need to stay in step with the Spirit.

God will never shield you from the requirements of being His son or daughter. So, do not think it strange when trials come your way—rise to the occasion. Do whatever the trial demands of you. It does not matter how difficult it is or how hot it gets in the hay field, if it gives God the opportunity to reveal the life of Jesus in you. And when necessary, God will send times of refreshing to see you through the trial. May God bless you and your family during the month of August.



Creating a Culture of Encouragement

The following testimony from Hope Kirkpatrick is one example of how God is working through our faithful church family to create a culture of encouragement that makes a profound difference in sharing the light of Jesus wherever we are. . . at home, at church, at work, or in the community.

Recently, our pastor led a beautiful sermon instructing the congregation on developing a “culture of encouragement” in our church members, which in turn leads to an encouraging church. I am not one who believes in coincidences, but I do believe in “God-incidences”. Therefore, this Spirit-led sermon being preached following a request I received to write a letter regarding how First United Methodist Church of Wetumpka has provided encouragement in my spiritual walk really did not come as big surprise, although it did cause me to send up a quick “I see what you did there” prayer to God.

I stumbled upon our church unintentionally. While strolling through Gold Star Park in the middle of a pandemic, I slowed as I passed a pastor preaching to a congregation that were sitting on rocks placed in a semi-circle I used to play on as a child. The church I had been attending (and if I am being completely honest, that was only sporadically) had switched to a virtual platform. I was falling behind in my Christian walk – as was typical for me during any major life change because I lacked a Christian support system. While still on that morning stroll, I pulled out that smart phone so many of us have glued to us and began to Google. It wasn’t very long before I was able to find out which church that congregation and pastor belong to – and I was thrilled!

As a teenager, I sporadically attended the First United Methodist Church of Eclectic. I became a member there as young adult with my baby and toddler boys. I was saddened that my time at that church came to an end, but it always held a special place in my heart. Since leaving that church, I found myself in numerous other churches of different denominations, but none ever felt like home. I failed to develop friendships within those church walls, always feeling like an outsider. The Sunday following my park stroll and Google find I found myself seated in front of that pastor and being welcomed with so many warm smiles, handshakes, and friendly greetings. I knew then that this church was special.

I admit, I made sporadic appearances during the first year or so of my attendance. I slowly got to know a few members through social media and began attending a Sunday school class after a prayerful encounter at the hospital I was working at. I enjoyed being around Christians who loved God and each other, but my opening up was a slow process. After a painful event in my personal life, I felt more lost than ever. But in the midst of that loss, I made the decision to commit to the church and become a member rather than turn away from God as I have done many times in the past. I chose to commit with service and love, to go “all in” so to speak. That commitment brought on a life change that could have only been made possible by God and a loving church family. As I began to open up to those around me I received something I never expected to receive – acceptance, love, and support.


I grew up without Christian leadership in my family, without one-on-one instruction regarding Christianity, and without a lot of love. I met Jesus at a young age, but without much encouragement in my Christian walk, I sought after the world much more than I sought after Jesus. When I finally let myself open up to trust this church, I found myself with something I had always been longing for – a Christian family. I have received so many loving messages, spent time with many people I am proud to call my brothers and sisters, learned from amazing teachers, received gifts and blessings that I will never be able to fully express my gratitude for, ate dinner with people who love me and support me, and have watched my two sons flourish with the guidance and love they have received from each and every person they come in contact with at our church. The encouragement I have received from this church has come in many different forms. The Christian love I am receiving is helping me to discover and walk down the path God has planned for me rather than the one I had planned for me. I am learning that nothing this world could offer can ever compare to the riches and glory that God has in store for me as I continue down this path of discipleship.

Thank you doesn’t even begin to cover the gratitude I feel for each and every one of you. And I hope that if you are reading this and haven’t opened your heart up to Jesus and this church that you do so without fear because your life will be changed, and you will change the lives of others. Thank you, First United Methodist Church of Wetumpka – my brothers and sisters in Christ.
