Why Do We Pray

In life we face situations that are beyond our control. Things happen to us that leave us wondering, how do I respond? What is my next action step? How do I make sense of all this? We are devastated by unthinkable events like the attack on 9/11 that destroyed so many lives. We are horrified by all the mass shootings and the loss of innocent lives. We are grieved when a loved one passes. We are distressed by the callous actions of our fellow man. We are overwhelmed by the diagnosis from our doctor. Life has a way of bringing us to our knees.

When life brings you to your knees you need an answer now! Who do you turn to in those difficult times? The psalmist reminds us, "Be still and know that I am God" (Psalm 46:10). As Christians we should turn to God. To 'be still' is to trust God with your life. When I trust God, I can wait patiently for God to act. It is in that waiting and trusting that God gives us the assurance that He will move mightily in our lives.

Tammy's recent diagnosis brought us to our knees and we turned to God in prayer. After surviving the blood infection last year, we were now facing a new dilemma. A new opportunity to pray. A new opportunity to trust God. Tammy's heart valve was damaged and not working properly. On Monday August 19th we were in her room, at UAB, waiting for the surgical team to take her down for a pacemaker. Hopefully, to stabilize her heart so she could have the surgery on Friday to repair her damaged valve.

That's when Dr. Sabouni and his assistant walked into Tammy's room. Dr. Sabouni is usually very controlled with his emotions. But on this occasion, he was all smiles as he sat down in a chair and said, "I have some good news. Based on the tests we ran this morning you don't need a pacemaker. And the echocardiogram you had two days ago, shows that your valve is functioning normally, much better than it was a month ago. We are going to do a heart catheterization just to verify all of our findings. If it all checks out you can go home today."

We were expecting Dr. Sabouni to tell us his plan for Tammy's upcoming surgery. But now he is telling us that she does not need the surgery. I said, "We both believe in the power of prayer and this is an answer to prayer." I barely got the words out because Tammy and I were both crying tears of joy. We could hardly believe what Dr. Sabouni was saying; even though Tammy and I both believe that God is the ultimate heart surgeon. That afternoon as we were driving back to Wetumpka, Tammy said, "God healed my broken heart." Praise the Lord! Hallelujah and glory!

Why do we pray? Because God's word tells us to pray. Blessings always follows obedience. Why do we pray for healing? Because when God heals, He is glorified. After Jesus raised Lazarus from the grave, he told Martha, "Did I not say to you that if you would believe you would see the glory of God" (John 11:40). To God be the glory!

May God continue to bless you and your family in the month of September, as you turn to Him in prayer.

Compassion: Caring enough to do something about someone else's needs.




